5. Tell me about a recent experience you've had working with your hands.

6. How do you stay fit in order to perform physical activities that are required in the workplace?

7. Tell me about an experience in which you analyzed information and evaluated results to choose the best solution to a problem.

8. Name a time when you drained, transferred, or removed molten metal from furnaces, and placed it into molds, using hoists, pumps, or ladles.

9. What is the most challenging part of observing operations inside furnaces, using television screens, to ensure that problems do not occur?

10. What have you found to be the best way to operate controls to move or discharge metal workpieces from furnaces?
