machinery such as ovens or on molds for dressing, returning them to conveyers or racks to send them to the
next work station?
9. Share an example of a time you had to gather information from multiple sources. How did you determine
which information was relevant?
10. What is the most challenging part of positioning dies on material in a manner that will obtain the
maximum number of parts from each portion of material?
