11. Give me an example of when you thought outside of the box. How did it help your employer?
12. Tell me about an experience in which you analyzed information and evaluated results to choose the best solution to a problem.
13. Would you consider analyzing data or information a strength? How so?

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14. Share an effective approach to working with a large amount of information/data. How has your approach
affected your company?
15. Share an example of a time you had to gather information from multiple sources. How did you determine
which information was relevant?
16. Provide a time when you were able to identify a complex problem, evaluate the options, and implement a
solution. How did the solution benefit your employer?
17. What have you found to be the best way to monitor the performance of your work and/or the work of others? Share a time when you had to take corrective action.

or improve an ongoing one. (Look for the candidate's ability to learn.)
