## Gastroenterology Technician Interview Questions

1. Share an experience in which your diligence of inspecting equipment, structures, or materials helped you identify a problem or the cause of a problem.

2. Walk me through how you clean, disinfect, or calibrate scopes or other endoscopic instruments according to manufacturer recommendations and facility standards.

3. In your opinion, what can be challenging when assisting physicians or registered nurses in the conduct of endoscopic procedures?

4. Describe a time when you successfully provided personal assistance to a coworker or patron.

5. Tell me about a recent experience you've had working with your hands.

6. Tell me how you organize, plan, and prioritize your work.

7. Share an experience when you applied new technology or information in your job. How did it help your company?

8. Tell me about the last time you monitored or reviewed information and detected a problem. How did you respond?

9. Share an example of a time you had to gather information from multiple sources. How did you determine which information was relevant?

10. Share an experience you had in dealing with a difficult person and how you handled the situation.

11. Describe methods you have found helpful to perform safety checks to verify proper equipment functioning.

12. How much time do you spend reading current literature, talk with colleagues, or participate in professional organizations or conferences to keep abreast of developments in endoscopy?

13. Share an experience in which you've successfully learned how to handle a new piece of equipment?

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14. Tell me about an experience in which you analyzed information and evaluated results to choose the best solution to a problem.

15. Share an example of when you went above and beyond the "call of duty". (Look for answers that show the candidate is dependable.)

16. What have you found to be the best way to collect specimens from patients using standard medical procedures?

17. Share an experience in which you successfully shared a difficult piece of information. (Make sure that the candidate has open lines of communication.)

18. Name a time when your patience was tested. How did you keep your emotions in check?

19. Provide an example when your ethics were tested.

20. Provide an experience in which you were sensitive to somone's needs or feelings. How did your helpfulness affect your work environment?

21. What kind of experience do you have placing devices, such as blood pressure cuffs, pulse oximeter sensors, nasal cannulas, surgical cautery pads, and cardiac monitoring electrodes, on patients to monitor vital signs?

22. Provide a time when you dealt calmly and effectively with a high-stress situation.

23. Provide a time when you worked in a rapidly evolving workplace. How did you deal with the change? (Make sure the candidate is flexible.)

24. Share a time when you willingly took on additional responsibilities or challenges. How did you successfully meet all of the demands of these responsibilities? (Make sure the candidate is a self-starter and can demonstrate some initiative.)

25. Tell me how you conduct in-service training sessions to disseminate information regarding equipment or instruments.

26. How do you stay up to date with new or improved techniques to validate or refresh basic professional skills?

27. Share an experience in which personal connections to coworkers or others helped you to be successful in your work. (Make sure candidate works well with others.)

28. Describe a time when you successfully serviced, repaired, calibrated, or tested a device that operates mainly by electronic principles.

29. Share an example of when you established and accomplished a goal that was personally challenging. What helped you succeed?

30. Please share with me an example of how you helped coach or mentor someone. What improvements did you see in the person's knowledge or skills?
