5. Describe an experience when you demonstrated assistive listening devices (ALDs) to clients.

6. Share your approach to create or modify impressions for earmolds and hearing aid shells.

7. Name a time when you trained clients to use hearing aids or other augmentative communication devices.

8. Describe an effective method to administer basic hearing tests including air conduction, bone conduction, or speech audiometry tests.

9. Tell me how you select and administer tests to evaluate hearing or related disabilities.
